- In 1896, *Current Affairs* published an article with “图书馆”.
- In 1898, Liang Qichao published an article *On Library and the institution of development of culture*

- In 1907, Sun Yuxiu published *Library*.

- In late Qing, Yang Shoujing, Fu Yunlong, Huang Qingcheng, Luo Zhenyu, Li Shuchang, et al, went to Japan to collect books.
- In 1926, Shanghai Library Association sent Du Dingyou to visit Japan.
